# LOVE YOUR LOCAL

MEET THE FAMILY BEHIND SOME OF ELLERSLIE'S MOST DELICIOUS PIES AND OWNERS OF RICHOUX PATISSERIE.

To say Jason Hay started from humble beginnings would be an understatement. Growing up in Cambodia he describes his family's situation as "very, very poor." Things changed in 2001 when his Aunty, who arrived in Auckland during 1980's as a refugee, sponsored him and his sister to come to New Zealand.

"When I arrived here I had the equivalent of \$7. We were just lucky, we met good people. We knew a Cambodian man who owned a bakery, I would clean for him and he taught me about the bakery and would give me leftover pies," he says.

Jason's passion for the baking industry was ignited. Since then, he has worked hard to perfect his craft, completing courses, participating in competitions and winning awards. He and his wife Annie bought Richoux in 2007 and have juggled the demands of a business that never sleeps with raising their three girls in the heart of the Village. Jason is now also Vice President of Baking New Zealand. Today, customers flock from all over Auckland for Richoux's award-winning pies which have created a buzz amongst the vegan crew thanks to the ever-increasing array of flavour combinations. At this time of year though, it's the legendary Christmas Mince Tarts which have customers queuing out the door.

"Business is going well. Every year we keep going forward. I'm grateful for how much support we've had. We work really hard to support our family and give back to the community," says Jason.




#### Give a helping hand
